






Students should be **dropped off no earlier** than **7:45am** and no later than **7:55am**. **Pick-up time for K-8 is 2:40**. These times are important to follow as we would like to avoid traffic in the bus circle when buses are arriving.

During drop-offs and pick-ups, we are asking all vehicles to wait behind the buses if they have already arrived. Once they depart, you can then drive around the bus circle, drop-off your child and continue around the bus circle to exit. Please refer to diagram. It would be beneficial to have your child exit the passenger side.

At no point should anyone drive in front of one of our buses, <u>especially if the red</u> lights are flashing.


Discipline

At Miramichi Rural we encourage respect and responsibility for everyone. Please make contact with the school if an issue arises and refrain from posting negative comments on social media outlets.

Security

To ensure the safety and security of all staff and students the main doors of the building will remain locked at all times.

If you plan on dropping your child off late (after 7:55 am) or plan to pick them up early, we are now asking that parents and guardians report to the office to **sign-in and sign-out their child**. If you know ahead of time that you are picking someone up, please send a note in with your child for their teacher at the beginning of the day.



Surveillance

Video cameras are used throughout the building and in all entrances. This was initiated and funded by EECD (Education and Early Childhood Education).



Bussing

<u>All students will be required to have one bus stop. No alternate stops will be accepted; the only exception will be for families with joint custody agreements.</u> A note must be sent each time to inform teachers when this occurs.

Students are not permitted to use the bus to be dropped off for birthdays, sleepovers, etc.

M.R.S. Code of Conduct

- 1. Please keep hats and ear buds off and hoodies down in the classroom so we can all stay focused and engaged.

Bucket Filler– Usually awarded to a gr.5 student (not mandatory) who is always thinking of others, showing compassion and kindness, all the while with a smile on their face, striving to do their best.

Outstanding Student– Usually awarded to a gr. 8 student (not manatory) who is considered by the staff of MRS as the most important honour that could be given to any one student. This award is to show that attitude, respectfulness, efforts in academic achievement and responsibility displayed of each individual student, never goes unnoticed.

Leadership– Awarded to a middle school student who shows by example and enhances the life of the school and the community.

Agnes Fowlie Award– Recipient is an individual who frequently has given selflessly, and has shown kindness and assistance to others, helping to create a caring community of learners at M.R.S.

Mary Harper Award- Awarded for most participation in school activities.

Mr. Mac's Elementary Athlete of the Year– Presented to a male and female for strong athletic ability and sportsmanship.

Mr. Bill Campbell Athlete of the Year (Middle School)– Presented to a male and female for strong athletic ability and sportsmanship.

Academic Awards will also be distributed for high academic achievement (4s' or better) in Math and Literacy.

Fine Arts Awards- Awarded for strong artistic ability.

Turn-Around Award– Presented to a student who has made significant improvements in the areas of behaviour, academics or social interactions.



MILK MILK

<u>Milk</u>

Milk cards cost \$15 each and this is good for 20 milk (which is \$0.75

cents per milk). When your child's milk card is running low, a top-up sheet will be sent home. If you are unable to afford to purchase milk cards please contact the school and an arrangement can be made.

<u>Canteen</u>

A canteen will once again be available during lunch hour. Most items are \$1.00, except milk which will be \$0.75 and Yop which is \$2.00. Students in K-3 will pre-order items in the morning. We ask families to place money (correct change if possible) in a Ziplock bag labelled with your child's name, grade and item ordered.

Students in grades 4-8 will be able to go to the canteen at lunch to purchase canteen items. Small change is encouraged.


Lunchtime Hints

To ensure that all students have the opportunity to enjoy a healthy and nutritious lunch, we ask that you consider the following, so that students eat in a timely manner:

- Refrain from sending items that require a can opener.
- Please send utensils and condiments, if needed, as they are not available.
- Metal thermoses are a quick and convenient item which allows children to readily access a delicious hot or chilled lunch.
- Please check your child's drink container for leaks.

Microwaves are available to middle school students (grades 6-8) only.

Microwaves are to be used to reheat foods, so please do not send items that require cooking. Please no KD cups, frozen dinners, etc.

BUS SAFETY RULES & REMINDERS



- 1. Walk to the bus.

Pupil Transportation is a privilege– follow the rules. Violation may result in disciplinary action and possible loss of transportation.

Teacher Contact

If you wish to communicate with staff, we kindly ask that you call the school or by email. You will find each staff email on our website under staff. Please refrain from reaching out to staff on their personal email or via social media outlets.

Safe Arrival

SafeArrival is an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for parents/guardians to let the school know about your child's absence.

Parents are asked to report their child's absence in advance

using one of these options:

If you have not yet signed up, you will be prompted to create an account. Part of the SafeArrival system is to notify parents by phone that their child is unexcused from school.



<u>School Access</u>- All visitors to the building must sign-in upon entering the building and report to the main office. If you have a matter to be discussed or have concerns, we highly encourage you to call and make an appointment as the Principal does teach throughout the day and is not always available.

<u>Scent Free School</u>- Due to the fact that a number of students and staff members experience either allergic or asthmatic reactions when exposed to scented products, such as colognes, perfumes, etc., and because of a heightened knowledge about the health effects on such sensitivities, Miramichi Rural School has implemented a scent-free policy. Therefore, all staff, students and visitors to Miramichi Rural School are requested to refrain from wearing perfumed or scented products.

<u>**Telephone Calls-**</u> Please note that we only have our Administrative Assistant in the mornings, so please call the school then if possible.

If no one answers, please leave a message and someone will get back to you as soon as possible (keep in mind that this may be at the end of the day).

Please do not leave messages on our Facebook Page if you require a timely response, as it may not be received until after school hours.

<u>Contact Information</u>– It is critical that the school receive your most up to date contact information. If your information changes throughout the year, please send us the new information ASAP. Additionally, we would appreciate having an email address on file as messages sent on our voicemail system also can be delivered as an email.

<u>Attendance</u>– Regular attendance is mandatory for all students in ASD-N. Research has shown a clear link between school absenteeism and academic achievement.

District Attendance Plan:

5+ days - Homeroom teacher calls home and Administrator is notified.

10+ days – Principal will make contact with home and a meeting may be scheduled to discuss a student intervention plan.

20+ days – Formal case conference with parent, students, teachers, principal and possibly District Office staff regarding attendance. Student may be asked to remain home until a meeting takes place. Interventions may include an alternate education setting. Ongoing absenteeism may result in grade retention.
